2022 Minor Party/Third Party Ballot Access

Political parties that did not receive 20 percent of the votes cast in the last General Election (§17-13-40, <u>Code of Alabama</u>, 1975), often called "third parties," must take the following steps in order to obtain statewide ballot access:

- At least 60 days before each election, file with the Secretary of State an original copy of the party's emblem and a copy in a digital or other electronic format acceptable by the Secretary of State. [§17-6-29]
- Certify candidates. A certified listing for state or federal candidates must be filed with the Secretary of State. A certified listing for county candidates must be filed with the local Judge of Probate. The listing of candidates is due on or before **5:00 p.m.**, **May 24, 2022,** the date of the primary election. [§§17-9-3(3) and 17-6-22]. For ballot access in special elections, please contact the Secretary of State or the Probate Judge for the deadline to file nominations.
- The last day for minor parties that have obtained ballot access to submit amendments or corrections to certifications of candidates is 76 days prior to the general election. [§17-6-21].
- File a petition containing signatures of at least **three percent** of the qualified electors who cast ballots for the office of governor in the last General Election in the jurisdiction or political subdivision for which ballot access is sought (e.g., statewide, county, district). A petition for statewide ballot access must have **51,588** valid signatures. The voters signing the petition must be registered to vote in the jurisdiction or political subdivision for which ballot access is sought.
- A sample petition form, which may be photo copied, is available from the Office of the Secretary of State and on the Secretary of State's web site: www.alabamavotes.gov.
- For ballot access in the 2022 General Election, the petition must be filed no later than **the date of the primary election**, **May 24, 2022**, **by 5:00p.m.**, with the Secretary of State to nominate candidates for state or federal offices or with the Judge of Probate for county offices. [§17-6-22].
- Minor party candidates not seeking a federal office are subject to the reporting requirements of the *Alabama Fair Campaign Practices Act*. Minor party candidates must file an **Appointment of Principal Campaign Committee Form** within five days of qualifying with the minor party or within five days of raising or spending more than \$1,000, whichever comes first. Additionally, when a minor party candidate raises or spends more than \$1,000, he or she must also begin filing campaign finance disclosure reports beginning with the next regularly-scheduled report.
- Minor party candidates not seeking a federal office must also file a **Statement of Economic Interests**, (§36-25-15). The **Statement of Economic Interests** must be filed with the Alabama Ethics Commission simultaneously with the date he or she qualifies with the minor party as a candidate. For information on filing the **Statement of Economic Interests**, call the Alabama Ethics Commission (334) 242-2997.

2022 Minor Party/Third Party Ballot Access

PETITION REQUIREMENTS

- A statement that includes the name of the political party seeking ballot access, the type of election for which ballot access is sought (i.e., general or special), the date of the general election, and the name of the political subdivision for which ballot access is sought or the name of the office for which ballot access is sought, including district or place number, if applicable. Petitions for the establishment of ballot access for a political party in a special election shall not be required to include the date of the special election at the top of each page. [Alabama Administrative Code, Rule 820-2-4-.05(2)]
- ➤ Numbered pages. [Alabama Administrative Code, Rule 820-2-4-.05(2)]
- Requested information for each person signing includes name, residential address, date of birth and signature. A signature shall not be deemed invalid for lacking any portion of the requested information if the disclosed information is sufficient for determining the validity of a signature. [Alabama Administrative Code, Rule 820-2-4-.05(3)]

PETITION SUGGESTIONS

- ➤ Have the voter sign in ink and write legibly.
- > Obtain signatures in excess of the required number, as some signatures may not be valid and/or identifiable.
- Keep a copy of the petition.

PETITION FILING LOCATIONS

Petitions for **statewide ballot access and for state and federal offices** must be filed in the **Elections Division of the Office of the Secretary of State**, located in the State Capitol, Room E-208, 600 Dexter Avenue in Montgomery, Alabama.

Petitions for **countywide and county district offices** must be filed in the office of the **county Judge of Probate.**
